What do we do?	<p>We aim to enable people with dyslexia regardless of age and abilities to reach their potential in education, employment and life. We run a range of support and services from our office in Stirling and branches, including a Helpline (0344 800 8484), website and social media, Tutor and Assessor lists, a range of information and advice, dyslexia awareness training and events.</p> <p>We have a network of 19 volunteer-led branches and 3 Adult Networks.</p> <p>We also aim to influence change for people with dyslexia by working in partnership with a range of organisations and policy makers at national and local levels.</p>
More details	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Assessment: We offer advice through our Helpline, website, information leaflets, branches and Adult Networks on dyslexia assessment for people of all ages; we offer assessments in Stirling carried out by a visiting psychologist 3 times a year; we manage the development and maintenance of an online Addressing Dyslexia Toolkit for teachers and other professionals. • Training: we offer tailored dyslexia awareness training (at a cost) to organisations from a wide range of sectors and backgrounds. Details on request or on our website. • Target groups: we work with people with dyslexia, their parents/carers and anyone who support people with dyslexia. • Referral routes: self-referral or via other agencies. • Costs: most of our services are free of charge (Helpline, website, events, open

	<p>meetings, roadshows, employment service, advice) but we do charge for our annual <u>Education conference</u>, membership and training.
