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<b>What to do we go?</b>	<p>Glasgow Life is a charity that delivers cultural, sporting and learning activities on behalf of Glasgow City Council.</p> <p>Glasgow Life manages a wide range of venues across the city, including community centres, libraries, museums and sports centres.</p> <p>Glasgow Communities operates through three Area Teams and works with the Learning Team to provide a varied range of services and facilities for communities across the city. This includes community based adult literacy and numeracy support in local venues, providing learning opportunities in a comfortable and familiar environment.</p>
<b>More details</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Glasgow Life tutors work with each individual adult learner over the initial learning sessions to capture previous learning experiences and determine learning needs, goals and levels. This is recorded as part of Glasgow Life's Individual Learning Plan. If an adult has been previously assessed as dyslexic, this will be recorded and taken into account by the tutor. While Glasgow Life does not offer bespoke dyslexia assessments, tutors design sessions so that they are appropriate to learners' needs. The learning programme is based on what the learners want to learn using everyday materials and resources.</li><li>• Learning is free and open to any adult aged 16 and over who lives, works or studies in Glasgow.</li></ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A number of Glasgow Life tutors have undertaken dyslexia training to support their tutoring role and other staff have participated in introductory dyslexia awareness raising sessions.</li><li>• Literacies support is tutored in small groups of no more than six people, and trained volunteers are available at some of the venues to support individual learners. Learners may have the option to work towards a SQA Communication award at Level 2 and 3.</li></ul>
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
